





Visiting New Zealand - VISA reminder

NZ Visa Information

You may not need to apply for a Visitor Visa if you are from a visa waiver country.

Visa waiver countries and territories include:

- Hong Kong (residents with HKSAR or British National–Overseas passports only)
- Japan
- South Korea
- United States

If you are travelling on a passport from a country not on the waiver list, you will need to apply for a visa online. The Tournament Visa Guide Information has been provided to assist you in completing the application.

Applications should be made as soon as possible but no later than 3 months before travel.

NZeTA

You must request an NZeTA before you travel if you travel on a passport from a country on the list of visa waiver countries and territories.

New Zealand Traveller Declaration

Everyone entering New Zealand needs to submit a declaration.

- It is free and takes about 10 minutes.
- You can do it on the NZTD app or online form, using your phone or computer.

The earliest you can submit your declaration is 24 hours before you start your trip to New Zealand. It needs to be submitted by the time you reach passport control in New Zealand.

The New Zealand Traveller Declaration collects travel, customs, immigration and biosecurity information. It aims to improve the safety and security of New Zealand.

Australian permanent residents normally need a NZeTA.

Transit Visas for other countries

You may need to apply for a Transit Visa from other countries if you are transiting through on your flights.

Australia

If you are not from an eligible transit without a visa (TWOV) country you will have to apply for a Transit Visa.

Insurance

All Team members must have appropriate accident and health insurance cover in order to compete.

Team Uniforms

Teams must ensure that they wear contrasting uniforms for each game scheduled. This is the responsibility of the team's as per the World Lacrosse Rules (summarised below).

Athlete Uniforms must identify team nationality, and athlete number. Commercial sponsorship/ advertising is permitted.

Team Colours

Participating teams must have two (2) sets of shirts - one light and one dark. Designs, logos, or other colours on the uniform must not in any way interfere with the primary colour of the shirt.

Except for the goalkeeper, all team members must be dressed uniformly. The goalkeeper's shirt must be the same colour as the team's shirt, and must be worn over their chest pad, and any shoulder/ arm pads. The bottom of the uniform must be the same predominant colour of the team's shorts or be a solid dark colour.

Please note tobacco/smoking/vaping sponsorship is BANNED in New Zealand.

Each athlete is required to wear a shirt with a contrasting number centred on the front and the back.

Numbers must be a solid block font. Numbers on the centre front of the shirt must be at least 20cm tall, and numbers on the centre back must be at least 25cm tall.



Training/Recovery Services & Meeting Rooms

If you have not booked any training/recovery services or meeting rooms, you still have the opportunity to do so at these prices.

Access to these services during the tournament will be charged at a higher rate and are dependent upon bookings received and confirmed prior to the tournament.

Discounted prices only apply until 31 October.

Wellington City is served by Metlink buses. Buses will replace the usual trains between Wellington to Upper Hutt, for the duration of the tournament.

Route 83 from Wellington to Lower Hutt and then a Route 110 to Fergusson Drive, approximately 1km (15 mins) from NZCIS.
